ESSAY QUESTIONS:

Please answer either one of the following questions but not both. Be sure to read your question carefully.

Why do you want to study Architecture?

This question pertains to your personal reasons for wanting to enter the architectural profession. Focus your response on your academic, professional and personal goals. In other words, tell us about the things you want to study in school, where you hope to work someday and in what aspect of the profession. We are especially interested in the things that appeal to you about architecture. List any work experiences relevant to Architecture, and anything else that could inform us about your interest in profession of Architecture.

How do you see the role of the Architect in the community and society?

In this question, your response could deal with how the Architect affects politics, the built environment, everyday life or any combination of these or other ideas. As in the previous question, we are interested in what interests you about the profession. Feel free to use work experience or any other personal experience as evidence in your essay.
